



BRIDGE CENTER FACILITY HIGHLIGHTS

Overall, The Bridge Center facility has admitted 2,141 guests and received 2,286 presentations.



Fourth quarter's guest presentations to the facility were 614, with 590 admits. Four hundred and ninety-five were unduplicated guests with a 16% quarterly readmission rate. (Guests are considered readmitted if they have been to the facility less than after discharge.)

Five hundred and sixty-four were from East Baton Rouge Parish, and 26 were from outof-parish residents for the fourth quarter.

In the fourth quarter, 393 people came into the facility on their own. In addition, first responder escorts account for 197 guests.

The average response time for the quarter was 3.44, and the average response time for the year was 3.53, which has consistently exceeded the projected average of 5 to 7 minutes.

4TH QUARTER TOTAL PER AGENCY

During the fourth quarter, 288 guests sought mental health services and 271 sought treatment for substance use services.



There were 2,141 residents admitted to the facility, with 1,947 from East Baton Rouge Parish and 194 from outside the parish.






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YEAR-TO-DATE STATISTICS

Of those 2,141 guests, 51% (998) sought substance use services, while 49% (972) sought mental health services.
