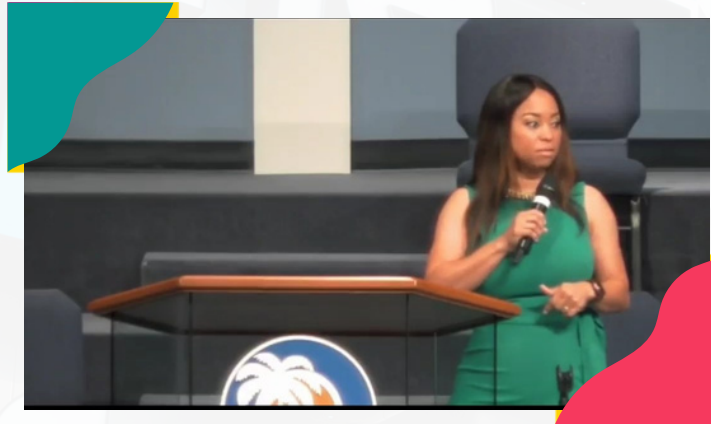


## BRIDGE CENTER FACILITY HIGHLIGHTS

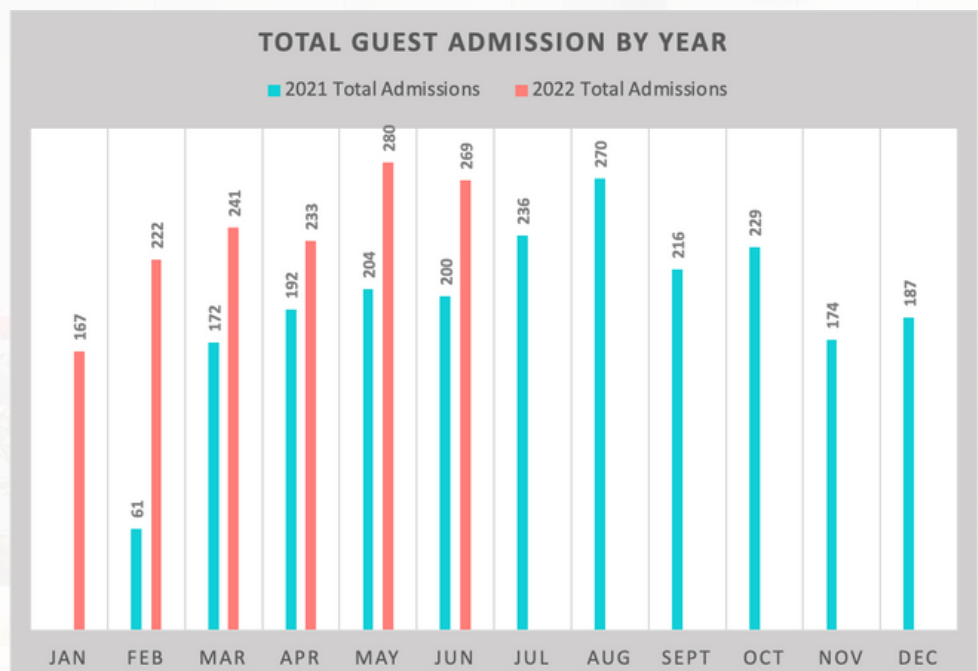
As the summer months approach, the Bridge Center for Hope continues to spread awareness through grass-root efforts. In June, the executive director spoke to Oasis Christian Church as part of their health initiative to share vital information with their congregation and community.



In **June**, the guest presentations to the facility were 277, with 269 admits. Two hundred and twenty-four were unduplicated guests with a 17% monthly readmission rate. (Guests are considered readmitted if served within 30 days or less after discharge.)

The total number of guest presentations for 2022 is 1,451 and 1,412 for admissions. The Bridge Center has helped over 3,738 individuals since the facility's opening.

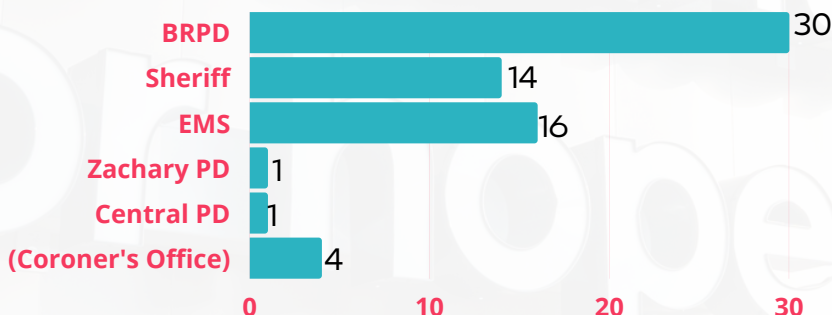
Two hundred and sixteen were East Baton Rouge Parish residents, and 53 were out-of-parish residents. The total number of East Baton Rouge Parish residents to receive services for 2022 is 1,175. The Bridge Center accepts all forms of payment: 80% of guests are covered by Medicaid, 18% utilized parish funding through the Bridge Center, and 2% are covered by Medicare and private insurers. Parish funding only covers East Baton Rouge Parish residents.

In June, 67% of the guest population is male and 32% female. In addition, 54% are black, 39% white, 2% Asian, and 1% other, with the remaining reported as no-entry.

Direct entry (walk-ins) continues to be the main source of entrance type amongst guests, accounting for 207 and 62 first responder escorts for June. The average response time for first responders was 3.00 minutes and a yearly average of 3.32 minutes.

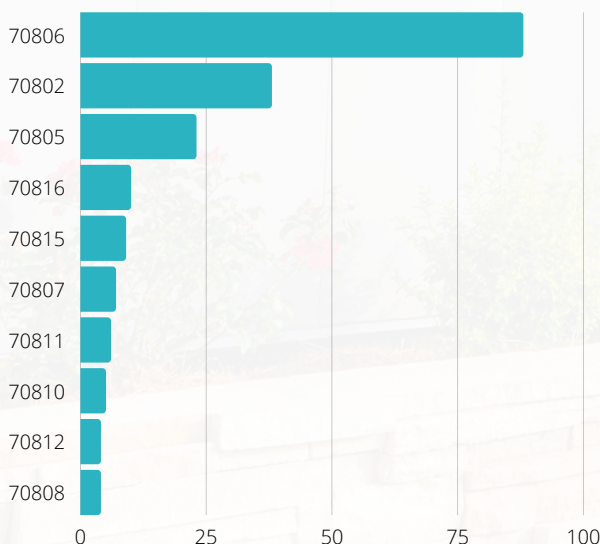
The Bridge Center, in collaboration with RI International, met with the East Baton Rouge Parish Sheriff's Office and will host a series of refresher training for the East Baton Rouge Parish Sheriff's office to provide additional education on how to access the Bridge Center.

The Bridge Center services residents from all over East Baton Rouge Parish. Below are the top ten zip codes served in June 2022.

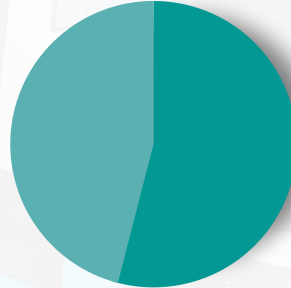

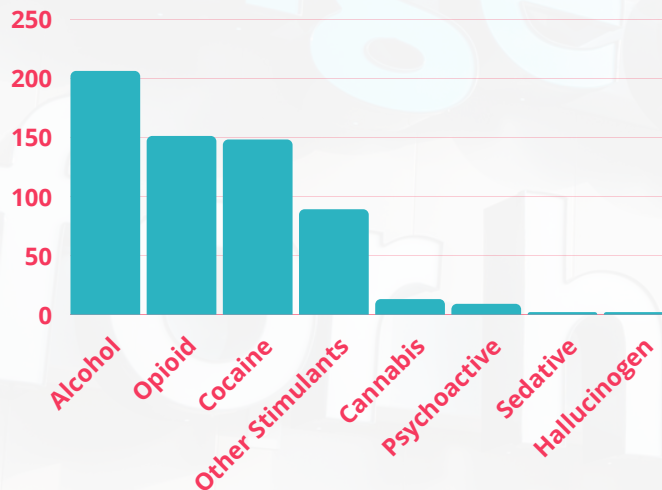
In the month of June, 128 (48%) guests sought mental health services, and 136 (51%) guests were treated for substance use services. The pie chart represents the total percentage of services received for mental health and substance use services for 2022.

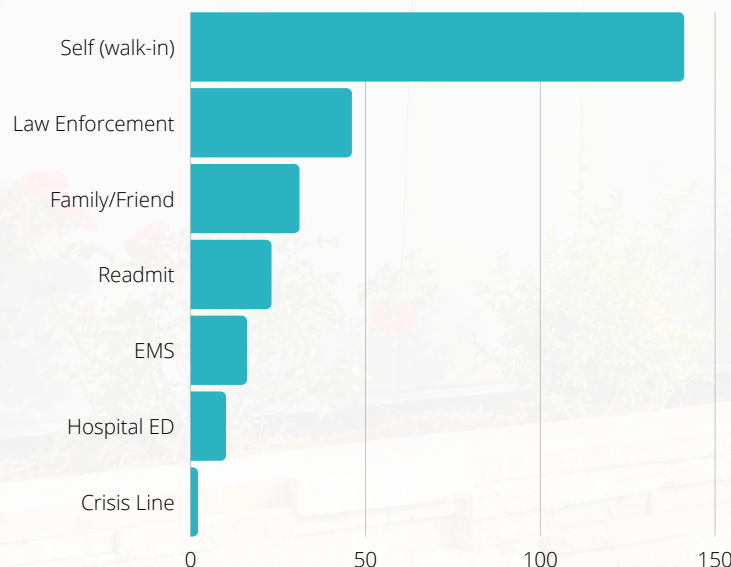


**Mental Health**

The chart below depicts treatment by substance type, and the treatment obtained for substance use during 2022. In June the top three (3) substances treated were Cocaine (32%), and Alcohol and opioid tied at 26%.
