

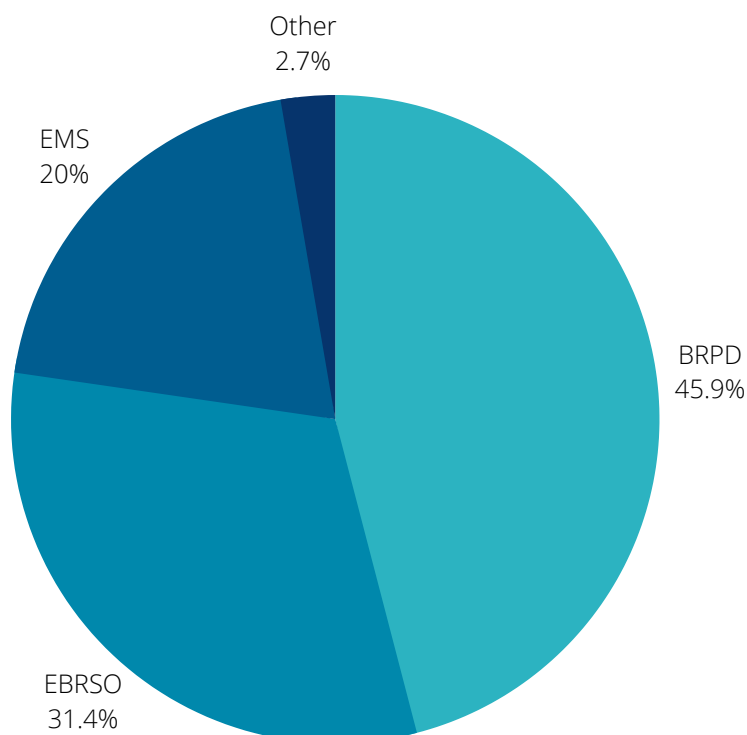
BRIDGE CENTER FACILITY HIGHLIGHTS

Throughout the first three months of 2022, the Bridge Center for Hope continued to raise awareness and educate the community through CIT training, community presentations, and a two-part virtual series titled, Crisis to Recovery, which highlighted the programs and services offered at the facility, the implementation of the 988 crisis line, and the Louisiana Department of Health's Coordinated Crisis Plan.

In the first quarter, the guest presentations to the facility were 645, with 630 admitted. Five hundred and twenty-four were unduplicated guests with an 18% quarterly readmission rate.

(Guests are considered readmitted if served within 30 days or less after discharge.)

During the first quarter, there were 445 direct-entry (walk-ins) and 185 accompanied by first responders. Details on first responders (local law enforcement and EMS) are provided in the table below. The average response time for first responders was 3.61 minutes.

Demographics

Among the guest during the first quarter, 78% were males, and 22% were females. Three hundred and fifty received mental health services, while two hundred and fifty-one received substance use services, and twenty-nine were unreported.
