BRIDGE CENTER FACILITY HIGHLIGHTS

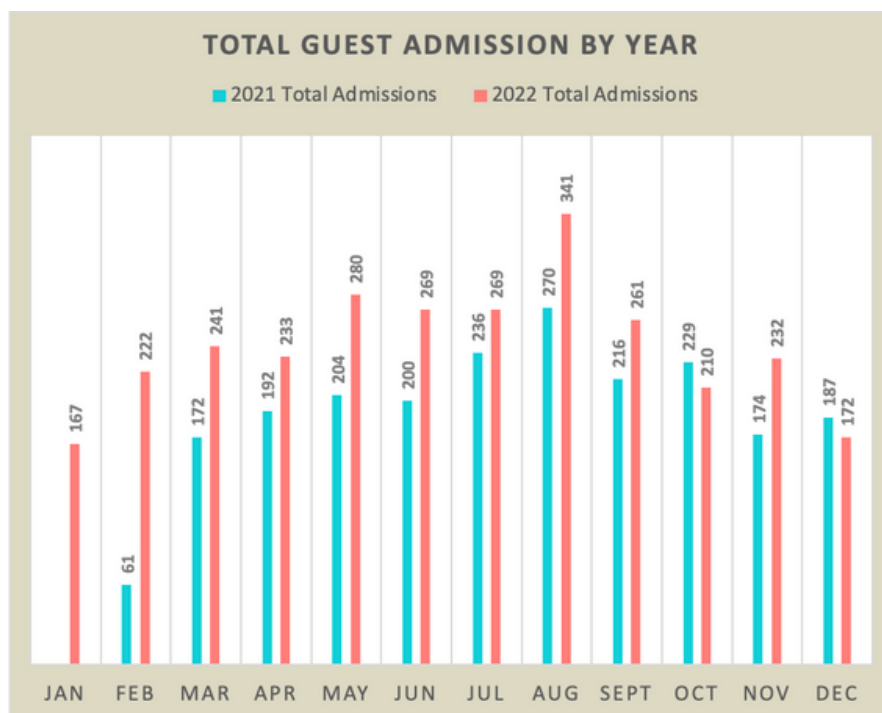


The Bridge Center for Hope recognizes the value of community involvement. As a result, the Bridge Center serves as a resource vendor for numerous community-based projects around the Parish. You can visit our newly updated website to learn more about crisis services, how we may help you, and whom we serve.

In December, there were 178 guest presentations to the facility, with 172 admitted. There were 139 unduplicated guests with a monthly readmission rate of 17%. (Guests are deemed readmitted if they are served within 30 days of discharge.)

The overall number of guest presentations for 2022 is 2,992, with admissions totaling 2,897. Since its inception, the Bridge Center has served over 5,278 people.

December Demographics

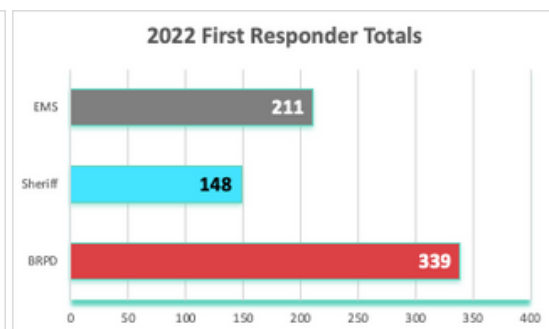
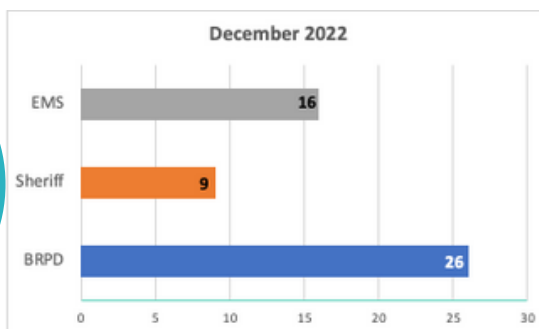
One hundred twenty-five were East Baton Rouge Parish residents, while 47 were out-of-parish residents. The total number of East Baton Rouge Parish residents who received services in 2022 was 2,334.

The Bridge Center accepts all forms of payment. In December, 78% of guests were Medicaid insured, 17% received parish funding through the Bridge Center, and Medicare and private insurers covered 5%. (Parish funding only applies to residents of East Baton Rouge Parish.)

In December, 72% of the guests were male, and 28% were female. Furthermore, 51% are black, 40% are white, 6% are no-entry, and 3% are other.

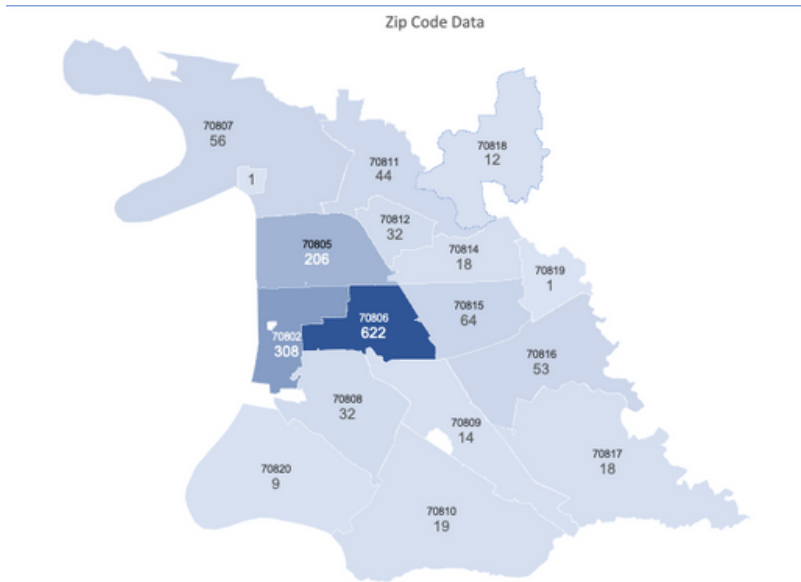
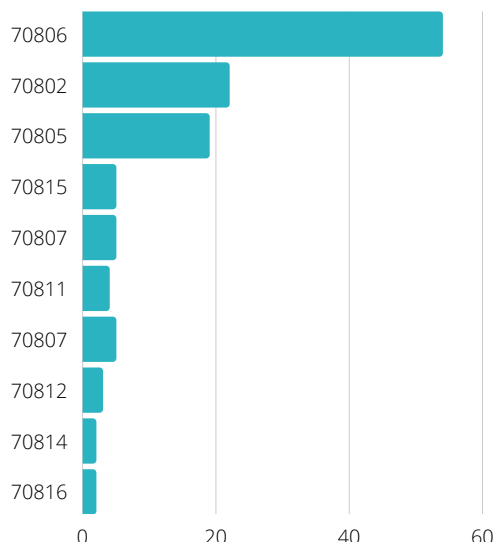
Direct access (walk-ins) continues to be the most common entrance among guests, accounting for 121 and 51 first responder escorts in December. The average response time for first responders was 3.00 minutes, a slight drop from November 2022 and a yearly average of 3.15 minutes.

The graphic below shows the top three stats of first responders escorted by the department.



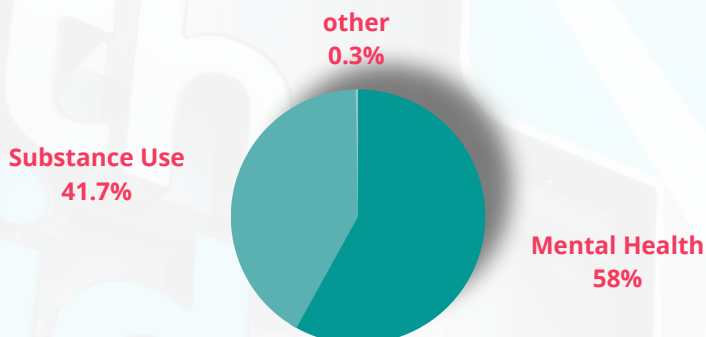
Area Demographics

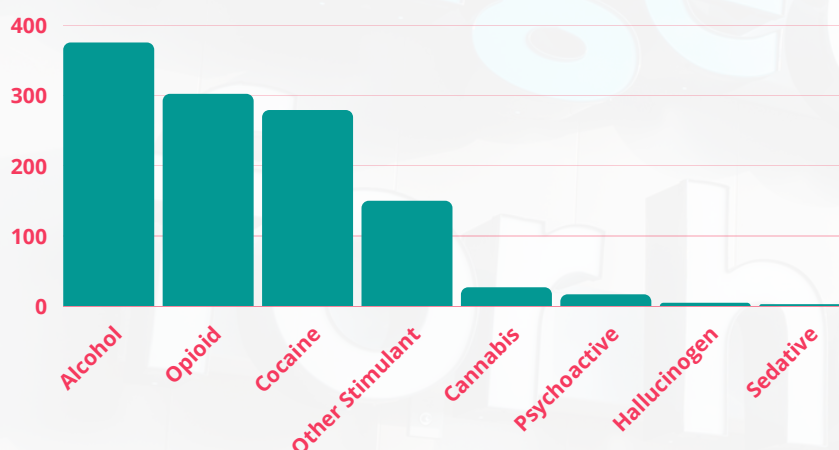

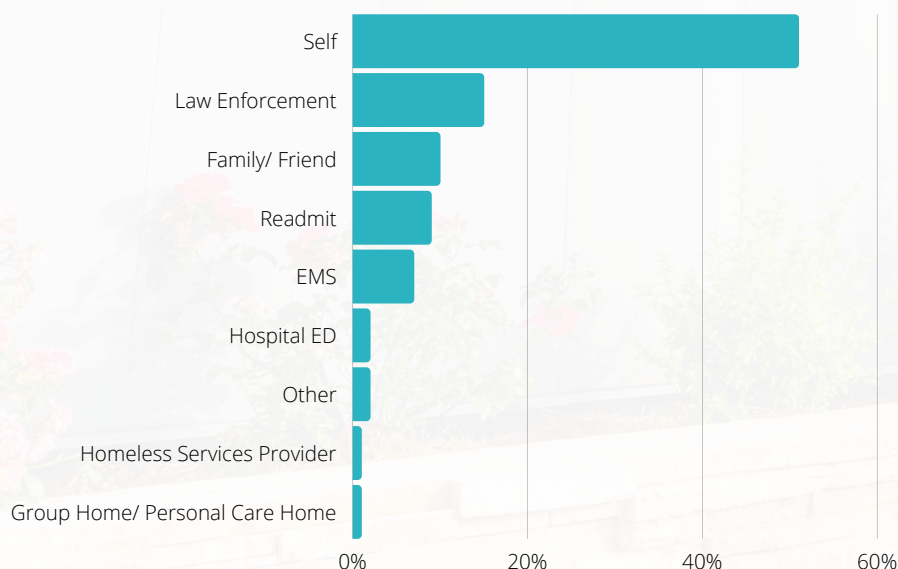
In the month of December, 120 (70%) guests sought mental health services, and 50 (29%) guests were treated for substance use services. The pie chart represents the overall percentage of services received for mental health and substance use services for 2022.



In December, the top three (4) substances treated were cocaine (34%), opioid and alcohol tied at (22%), and stimulant (20%). The chart below depicts treatment by substance type and the treatment obtained for substance use during 2022.
