

BRIDGE CENTER FACILITY HIGHLIGHTS

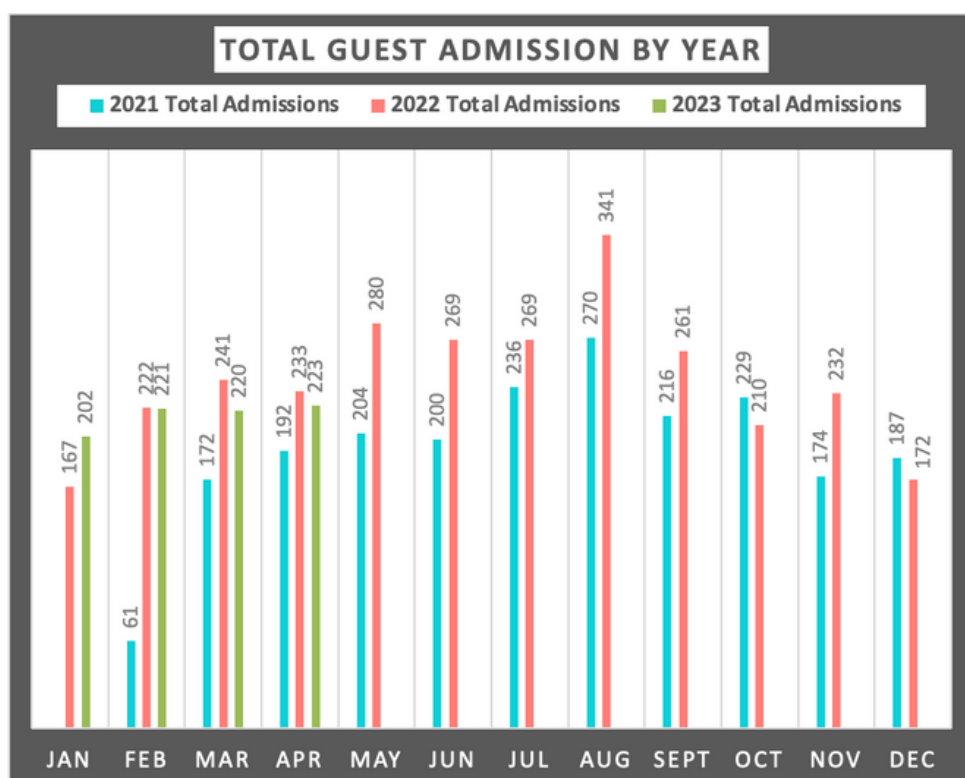


Community engagement is crucial to the Bridge Center for Hope. As a result, the Bridge Center serves as a resource provider for a variety of parish-wide community-based events. In April, the facility received 231 guest presentations, with 223 admitted. There were 182 unique guests, with a monthly readmission rate of 17%.
(If served within 30 days of discharge, guests are considered readmitted.)

There have been 6,194 guest presentations since the facility's opening, with 5,904 admissions.

Below is a comparison of admissions by month and year.



April Demographics

In April, 194 residents from East Baton Rouge Parish were treated, while 29 were from outside the parish. Since the facility's opening, a total of 4,993 East Baton Rouge Parish residents and 911 out-of-parish people have received services.

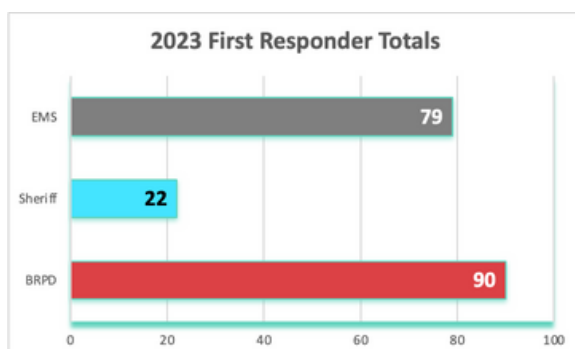
The Bridge Center accepts all forms of payment. In April, 78% of guests were Medicaid insured, 17% received parish funding through the Bridge Center, and Medicare and private insurers covered 5%.

(Parish funding only applies to residents of East Baton Rouge Parish.)

In April, 75% of the guests were male, and 25% were female. Additionally, 58% are black, 38% are white, and 4% were reported as other.

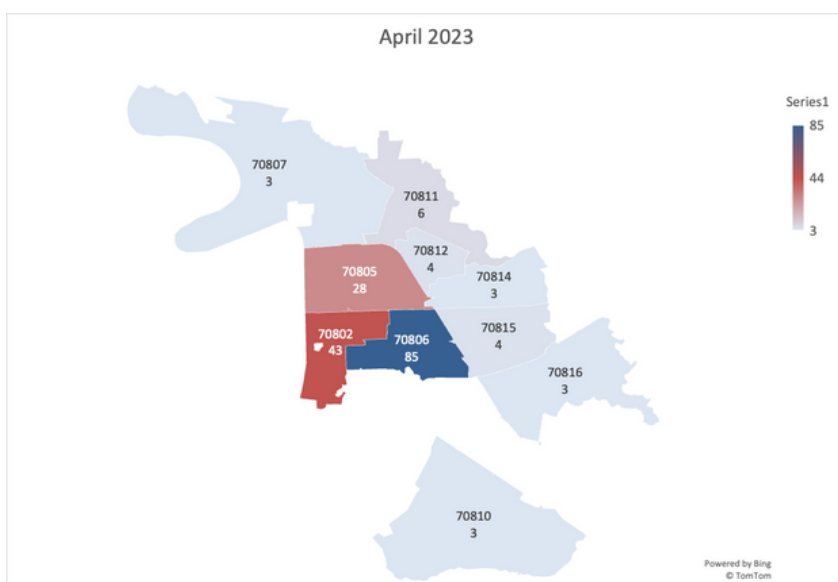
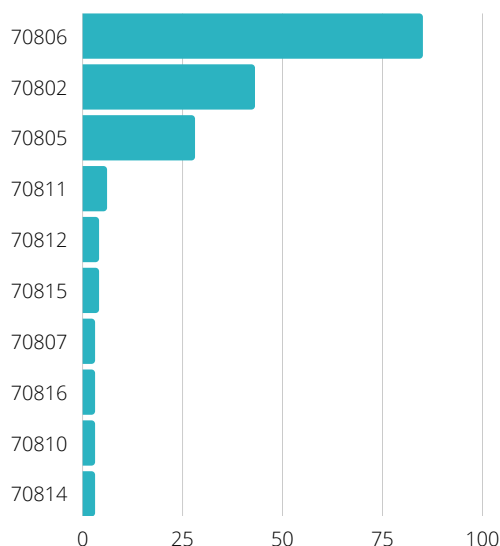
Direct access (walk-ins) continues to be the most frequent method of admission for guests. In April, 176 accounted for direct entry, and 47 were escorted by first responders. The average response time for first responders continues to remain under 5 minutes at 2.88 minutes.

Area Demographics

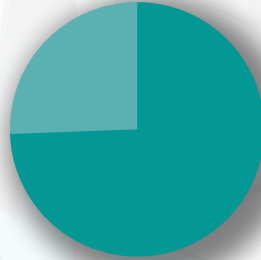
The map represents the top zip codes served for April 2023 in East Baton Rouge Parish.

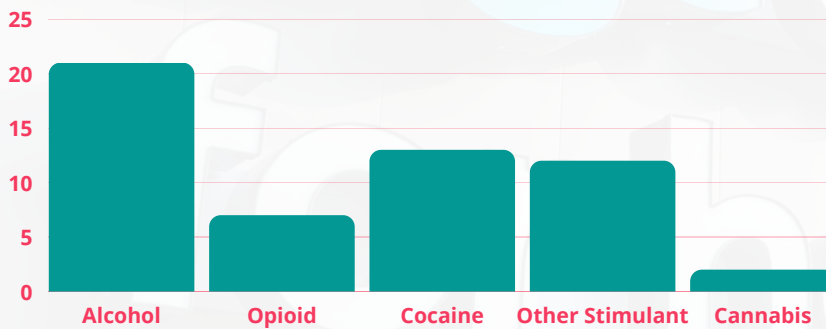
In April, 155 guests (70% of the total) sought mental health care, while 58 guests (26% of the total) were treated for drug use. Thirty-nine percent of guests seeking treatment are dual diagnosis. The pie chart depicts the overall percentage of mental health and drug use services received in 2023.

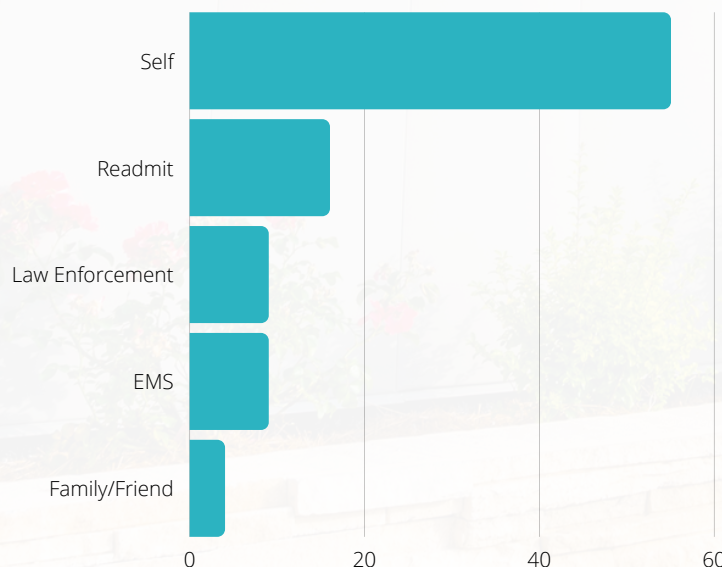

In April, the top three (4) substances treated were alcohol (36%), cocaine (26%), opioids (17%), and stimulants (14%). The chart below depicts treatment by substance type and the treatment obtained for substance use during 2023.
